The Prairie Trails Public Library District has passes to Brookfield Zoo available to library card holders in Burbank and Nottingham Park communities. Each **Wild about Reading** pass allows **four** adults and/or children to gain **free** admission to Brookfield Zoo during regular zoo hours. The **Wild about Reading** pass is available at the Prairie Trails Public Library District on a first come, first served basis.

Wild About Reading – Rules

Prairie Trails Public Library District patrons **ONLY** may check out the passes.
Must be 18 years of age and have a library card in good standing.
Loan Period – same as DVD/Video.
One pass per household, per three day loan period.
Pass must be handed to circulation clerk when returned.
Sorry, no book drop returns.
Fees: \$1.00 if found in book drop, \$2.00 per day until returned, \$50.00 replacement fee if lost.
No renewals.
No reserves – first come first served basis only.
Parking fee is not included with the pass. It is the responsibility of the patron.

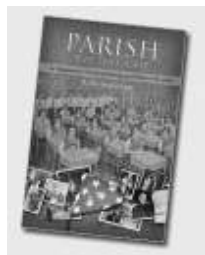
