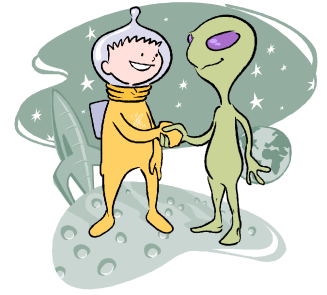
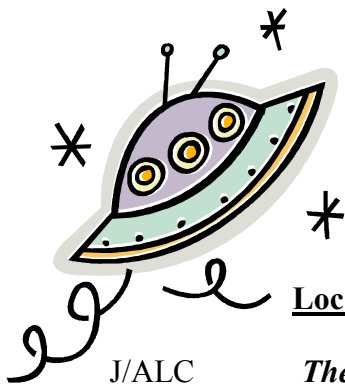


# Chapter Book Science Fiction

- J/ALC      *The Monster Garden* by Vivien Alcock. Using a tissue sample she believes is from one of her father's experiments in genetic engineering, Frankie accidentally creates a baby monster, which begins to grow at an alarming rate (164p).
- J/APP  
J/BAW      *Animorphs* (series) & *Remnants* (series) by K.A. Applegate (150-200p).  
*Off the Road* by Nina Bawden. In 2040, eleven-year-old Tom follows his grandfather through the Wall and into the forbidden Wild, where they seek to find his grandfather's boyhood home (192p).
- J/BEN      *The Invisible Fran: Franny K. Stein, Mad Scientist* (series) by Jim Benton. When Franny Stein, self-styled mad scientist, creates a robot to show her school friends the joys of science, she ends up learning something from them instead (101p).
- J/BUT      *The Door in the Lake* by Nancy Butts. After vanishing without a trace one night during a camping trip, twelve-year-old Joey reappears two years later, showing no signs of having aged and carrying memories of a strange light in the sky (159p).
- J/CIE      *Dinoverse* by Scott Ciencin. When thirteen-year-old Bertram and three friends find themselves living in dinosaur bodies sixty-seven million years ago, they discover new ways to think about their lives (282p).
- J/CLE      *Things Not Seen* by Andrew Clement. When fifteen-year-old Bobby wakes up and finds himself invisible, he and his parents and his new blind friend Alicia try to find out what caused his condition and how to reverse it (251p).
- J/COL      *The Supernaturalist* by Eoin Colfer. In futuristic Satellite City, fourteen-year-old Cosmo Hill escapes from his abusive orphanage and teams up with three other people who share his unusual ability to see supernatural creatures (267p).
- J/COV      *The Monsters of Morley Manor* by Bruce Coville. Anthony and his younger sister discover that the monster figures he got in an unusual box are alive. The "monsters" will lead them on adventures to other worlds in an effort to try to save Earth (224p).
- J/GUT      *Virtually Perfect* by Dan Gutman. When twelve-year-old Yip uses his father's new software to make a computer simulation of a boy his age, the creation breaks out of cyberspace into the real world and begins to complicate Yip's life (123p).
- J/HAD      *Among the Betrayed* by Margaret P. Haddix. Thirteen-year-old Nina is imprisoned by the Population Police, who give her the option of helping them identify illegal "third-born" children, or facing death (156p).
- J/HAD      *Among the Hidden* by Margaret P. Haddix. In a future where the Population Police limit a family to only two children, twelve-year-old Luke has lives in isolation and fear on his family's farm, until another "third" convinces him that the government is wrong (153p).
- J/KAY      *Replica* (series) by Marilyn Kaye. (133p)
- J/LOW      *Gathering Blue* by Lois Lowry. Lame and suddenly orphaned, Kira is removed from her village to live in the Council Edifice, where she is expected to use her gifts as a weaver for the all-powerful Guardians (215p).
- J/LOW      *The Giver* by Lois Lowry. Given his lifetime assignment at the Ceremony of Twelve, Jonas becomes the receiver of memories shared by only one other in his community and discovers the terrible truth about the society in which he lives (180p).

- J/LOW ***The Messenger*** by Lois Lowry. Matty, a young member of a utopian community that values honesty, conceals an emerging healing power that he cannot explain or understand (169p).
- J/MAC ***Can of Worms*** by Kathy Mackel. Bullied and unhappy at school, thirteen-year-old Mike sends a distress call into space asking to be rescued from the cruelty of his life on Earth (146p).
- J/MAC ***Eggs in One Basket*** by Kathy Mackel. With the help of two middle school classmates and a bear-like talking "dog", seventh-grader Scott discovers that he can be a hero in other ways than on the football field (195p).
- J/MCM ***Countdown to the Year 1000 (Dragon Slayer Academy)*** by Kate McMullan. Alarmed by a prophecy that the world will end with the arrival of the year 1000, the students of Dragon Slayers' Academy get some advice from Zack, a boy who has traveled back from 199 (107p).
- J/PAU ***The Time Hackers*** by Gary Paulsen. When someone uses futuristic technology to play pranks on twelve-year-old Dorso Clayman, he and his best friend set off on a journey through space and time trying to stop the gamesters (87p).
- J/PHI ***The Last Book in the Universe*** by W.R. Philbrick. A thousand years in the future, an earthquake destroys much of the planet, and an epileptic teenager nicknamed Spaz begins the heroic fight to bring human intelligence back to Earth (223p).
- J/SCI ***2095 (Time Warp Trio)*** by Jon Scieszka. While on a field trip to a museum, Joe, Sam, and Fred travel one hundred years into the future, where they encounter robots, anti-gravity disks, and their own grandchildren (72p).
- J/SEI ***Brainboy and the Deathmaster*** by Tor Seidler. When Darryl, a twelve-year-old orphan, is adopted by a technology genius, he finds himself the star of his very own life-threatening video game (311p).
- J/SKU ***Virtual War*** by Gloria Skurzynski. In a future world, three young people with unique genetically engineered abilities are teamed up to wage a war in virtual reality (152p).
- J/SLE ***Marco's Millions*** by William Sleator. Twelve-year-old Marco's love for travel and for his younger sister Lilly, who has psychic powers, leads him to journey to other universes, gaining the ability to go wherever he wishes without growing old (161p).
- J/SPY ***One Agent Too Many (Spy Kids)*** by Elizabeth Lenhard. (140p)
- J/STA ***Star Wars books*** by various authors.
- J/WAU ***Earthborn*** by Sylvia Waugh. Upon learning that her parents are researchers from another planet and they must leave in seven days, twelve-year-old Nesta decides to stay in their York, England, home (273p).
- J/WAU ***Space Race*** by Sylvia Waugh. When he learns that he and his father must soon leave Earth, eleven-year-old Thomas Derwent is upset, but a terrible accident that separates the two of them makes Thomas's situation much worse (241p).
- J/WAU ***Who Goes Home?*** by Sylvia Waugh. On his thirteenth birthday, Jacob learns a secret about his birth and becomes involved in his father's work to protect other beings from the planet Ormingat who live on Earth (213p).
- J/WEL ***The War of the Worlds*** by H.G. Wells. As life on Mars becomes impossible, Martians and their terrifying machines invade the earth (228p).
